On the 3rd and 7th of August, Volunteers cleaned the Campus for making a good atmosphere for students. On August 5th, as a part of 'Swatch Pakawara', we conducted a campus rally on August 10th, and also participated in a flood relief collection camp jointly organized by 'Signature S5 Nishagandhi' and Trivandrum corporation.

On the 14th of August, together with Nehru Yuva Kendra, we conducted a declamation contest "patriotism & Nation building". 73rd Independence Day was celebrated on 15th August 2019 in the College campus by hoisting the tricolour flag. It was a grand celebration with several cultural programmes. On 22nd of August, 40 volunteers participated in a special convocation ceremony, conducted in the Kerala University Senate Hall, to honour Shri. Chris Gopala Krishnan and Dr. Jayant V. Narikar with doctorate degree.

In the month of September, our volunteers worked to ensure maximum collection in the relief camp from 8th to 17th September. On NSS day (24th September), a food fest was conducted 'Nattinpurathe Vismayam' and a Plastic free exhibition. This programme was inaugurated by our principal Dr.G. Vijayalakshmi. Almost 178 volunteers actively participated in it. 52 of our NSS volunteers participated in a 'Walkathon' conducted by SUT Pattom on 28th September 2019, as part of World Heart day.

The month of October started with the observation of 'Gandhi Jayanthi' on 2nd October 2019. NSS volunteers devoted this day to campus cleaning. In association with the Economics dept, our NSS units organized an awareness class in lines with the Gandhi's message, "My Life is My Message". On the same day, a class on 'Anti-Narcotism' was conducted by our NSS units with Ms.Dhanya Ravi as the speaker. ASI Mr.Shajahan was the resource person. On 5th October, our volunteer Hridya G.M., actively participated in a state level leadership camp entitled 'Trial 2019', conducted by BJM College, Chavara, Kollam. On 18th October, 55 volunteers cleaned our NSS room and its premises. A blood donation camp was organized by our NSS units in association with Nehru Yuva Kendra & HDFC Bank on 25th October, 2019. A total of 125 volunteers participated in this event.

An awareness class on 'Sustainable Periods' was conducted on 12th November. Two of our volunteers participated in a 3 day leadership camp, organized by NSS , Kerala University, on 14th November,2020. A total of 11 volunteers participated in 'Udyanam' project conducted at Thirumala, on 14th November. On 16th and 17th November, our volunteers cleaned the campus specifically removed debris like Polythene bags. Our NSS Units conducted an awareness programme on 'Waste disposal' among students.

The award presentation ceremony of NSS , University of Kerala, for the year 2018-2019, was inaugurated by the honourable MLA Adv. V.K.Prasanth on 20th November in our College. On the same day, a photo exhibition was arranged in College auditorium which highlighted the achievements of NSS Units of various Colleges under the University of Kerala from 2017 to 2019. The exhibition was inaugurated by Dr.Sajith Babu, State Co-Ordinator. A 3 day seminar on "Indian Women- Yesterday, today and tomorrow" was conducted by the University of Kerala at University Senate chamber. 10 of our volunteers participated in the seminar. An Antidrug initiative camp was point of attraction, which was held on 21st to 22nd November at Students Centre, Kerala University.


On December 1st, World Aids day, NSS Volunteers conducted a rally at Govt. College for Women. It was initiated by NSS P.O. Dr.Santhi P. and then followed by around 50 volunteers. On 9th December, we organized an orientation class on blood donation along with 'Janani' organisation. A self defence class entitled in" Thada' was taken by Mrs. Sulphath, Kerala Police. 175 NSS volunteers attended the programme. On 10th December, there was a special convocation programme organized by Kerala University at Senate hall ,in which hon'ble Governor, Minister for Education, Govt. of Kerala took part. 49 volunteers participated in the programme. There was an award function for Ms. Latha for achieving the 'Women of the year' prize. It was awarded by the Governor on 12th December.

In the month of January ,2020, we were able to conduct an awareness class jointly organized by Nehru Yuva Kendra & our NSS units in relation with National Youth Day. Swami Athmadas Yami Dharmapaksha delivered a speech on 13th January 2020. A survey was taken on the adopted village 'Chengalchulla' based on Anti-Drug & Health Survey initiative, as a part of the camp. Almost 94 volunteers took part in this survey. A seven day camp was organized by our NSS unit from January 28th to February 3rd with full attendance.

In connection with world cancer day, a lecture was conducted in RCC on February 7th 2020. Almost 10 Volunteers participated in this lecture. NSS volunteer participated in 'Vimukthi Jwala' an anti-drug campaign under 'Vimukthi', an event on 7th February at Kanakakkunnu Palace. On 13th Feb, our NSS units given Paper basket making training to NSS Volunteers of All Saints' College, TVPM. On 15th February, 2020 our volunteers participated in a workshop on 'life skills', organized by Family planning association of India, in collobration with Gandhi Smarak Nidhi and BSW students of National College. Dr.V.Reghu, Former Controller of Examinations, Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, led the workshop. On the same day, our NSS Volunteers also became a part of cycle rally, related to the observation of 'Zero Waste day' initiated by Green Army. Some of our volunteers were allotted to watch the 'Trip' which was made by NSS volunteers and released at 'Kalabhavan theatre on 26th February. On the same day, NSS volunteers had attended the 'Kashmiri Youth Exchange programme' at VJT Hall, where they got an opportunity to interact and learn the culture of Kashmiri people. On the last day of the month, a medical camp for lifestyle diseases was hosted by our College NSS Units, in association with Kerala Social Security Mission, Malabar Gold, Museum Janamythri Police, at Assembly hall. There was a free blood check-up facility for first 100 people.

There was a National Integration Camp, which was organized by National Service Scheme, and Ministry of Youth affairs and Sports from 21st day of February to 24th day of the month. The camp was conducted at Marian College, Kuttikkanam, Idukki. In the month of March, a meeting was conducted, in co-operation with Green Army, for volunteers. Our Volunteers successfully completed their duty by ensuring Green Protocol and waste management during Attukal Pongala on 6th, 7th and 8th of March. NSS Units of Govt.College for Women had made a fruitful academic year through their selfless social service.
